Being rude, condescending, providing unconstructive criticism or impeding one of our volunteers or contractors from completing their duties will result in disciplinary action by the board, up to expulsion from the club.

We do not make these decisions lightly, but with the growth in membership we must be diligent to make sure everyone is playing nice with one another.
